#### **Associate Principals Updates**

#### **Term 3 Take Home Reading**

During Week 11 we have been completing an audit of our reading resources across the school. This has involved a stocktake of every reader within the school to enable us to see how many resources we have, the quality of our resources and areas of need for purchasing in the coming school year.

In the first 2 weeks of Term 3, as we begin to accession our readers into the new reading system, students will not be receiving 'take-home' readers from class teachers. We are currently prioritising the levelling process of the new reading system to be able to provide 'home-readers' for students as soon as possible.

While this process takes place please make use of your child's subscription to Reading Eggs or Lexile Literacy Pro (depending on year level).

#### **2022 Enrolments Now Open**

Applications are now open for Kindy to Year 6 enrolments for 2022. Application forms have been sent home with current Kindy students or are available from the office. Please note that as Pre Primary is now a compulsory year of schooling, it is not necessary to re-enrol for Year 1.

#### **ICAS Overview**

Please find attached an information and permission letter regarding ICAS assessments for Years 4 - 6 students in Term 3 2021. These assessments are not compulsory, however if a parent would like to register their child for any of the assessments please read the letter attached to this eNews carefully. Parents are required to register their child for the assessments using the information below (also in the letter) and return the permission slip to the school.

ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals and are invited to attend special award ceremonies to have their academic excellence publicly recognised.

We encourage you to consider entering your child into ICAS this year. The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment, that has been running for 40 years. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision.

#### **NAIDOC Week Celebrations**

NAIDOC stands for National Aboriginal and Islander Days of Celebration.

This year's theme is 'Heal Country'. You will see a lot of NAIDOC celebrations around the city, so embrace the cultural experience and help celebrate. Although we were disappointed at not visiting the Swan River (Derbal Yerrigan) for our bush walk, we definitely had fun completing our NAIDOC Week spotto around the school. We look forward to rescheduling our bush walk next term —learning by the river (bilya kaatajin).

Across the school we had different activities this week, with our Kindy students engaging in the different play provocations involving story rocks, hand painting, and dreamtime stories. Our Pre-primary students read the Dreamtime Story 'How the Birds Got Their Colours', and used this to create their own colourful dreamtime birds.

Our Year 1 students worked collaboratively to design and create The Waugal (Rainbow Serpent) and learnt how the Rainbow Serpent rose up from Ga-ra-katta (Mt. Eliza at the foot of Kings Park), and formed the Derbarl Yerrigan and the Djarlgarro Beelier (the Swan and Canning rivers). It also created other waterways and landforms around Perth and the south-west of Western Australia. Waugal has many different spellings, including Waakal, Wagyl, Wawgal, Waugal, Woggal and Waagal. We can't wait to see the end result!

Our older years used our on-site Makuru Spotto activity, created by Mrs Hull, to locate and identify different flora and fauna around our school such as: the bush cherry, saltbush, grass tree, bush basil, djidi djidi (willy wagtail), kaa kaa (kookaburra) and kwenda (possum). Makuru Spotto was lots of fun and our students were able to locate everything on site except for our local kwenda!

We look forward to creating more opportunities to achieve our Nedlands Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) targets throughout 2021. The RAP will develop year on year. As it does so, we will continue to respectfully acknowledge the Whadjuk people of the Noongar Nation as the Traditional Owners of the Land on which we stand and pay our respects to Elders past, present and future.



#### **STEM @ Nedlands**

#### Year One: 'It's My Town'

Last week, some of our Year One students enjoyed sharing their STEM learning project with their parents. Children gave a brief presentation of their learning about lines, 2-D shapes and 3-D objects, and how they used their knowledge to plan, draw and then build a 3-D town of their own.

Popular facilities included in the town were ice-cream shops, K-Mart, BHP, Police Stations and swimming pools. Not only did the children have a wonderful time building their town, they learnt just how difficult it is to be a town planner. It was wonderful watching the children develop their collaborative learning skills to problem solve challenges that arose.

#### Year Two: 'The Little Red Hen'

The Year Two STEM project involved designing, building and programming a device to carry wheat to the mill for the Little Red Hen. After several failed attempts and many modifications to their original design, students successfully completed the challenge.

There was much collaboration, sharing of ideas and a developing awareness of the need to problem solve at each step of the process. The Year Two's are already looking forward to their next STEM challenge next term!





#### **Year 3 Kings Park Excursion**

The Year 3 had a fabulous day at Kings Park Education Centre learning about the plants and how seeds grow and bush skills.

The students brought back some seeds they planted that had 'fire water' sprinkled on them as this is how seeds grow after a fire had burnt the bush. These are in the vegetable garden awaiting the sun and weather to help start the growing process, and when they do, we will get Barry our gardener, to plant them in a good spot.

The children had a challenge of Child vs Wild where they learnt to build a camp, using a tarpaulin and rope, along with making damper in a fire and eating it with honey. Then they had to pretend to have someone with a snake bite and bandage their leg as first aid. Many skills were learnt during the whole day.

#### Health & Wellbeing @ Nedlands

During Peer Support students have looked at how to play in a friendly way in order to maintain friends and build positive relationships. Through various activities students discovered the importance of taking turns and having consistent rules throughout a game. It would be great if students can practise these skills by playing games with siblings, family and friends. Last week in Peer Support students explored how to join groups and how to accept others into their friendship

group. They practised these skills with each other.

The Student Expectation our Health and Wellbeing Councillors have been looking for this week is students who are welcoming to students and visitors. The class who has been welcoming to other students and visitors and who will have 'Hope' visit their

classroom this week is Year 2, Room 5. It was great sharing Peer Support with
