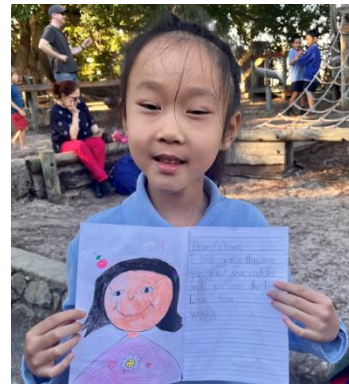

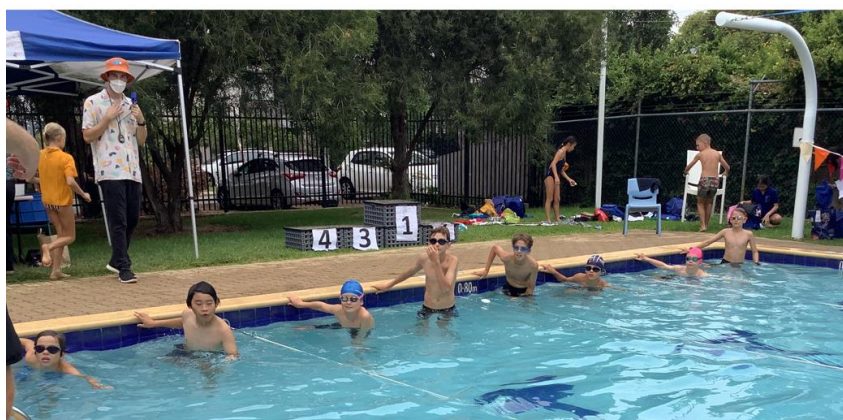

Here are the results from Interschool Carnival. Some key points:

- Miranda McVee came 1st in the Year 5 girls A division 50m backstroke. Miranda won runner-up Year 5 Champion Girl for her efforts.
- Qiana Chen came 2nd in all 4 of her individual events including the **Open** 50m Butterfly as a Year 5 swimmer – fantastic effort. Professional Develop for Us All

Childhood trauma

Children who have experienced complex trauma resulting from neglect, abuse, violence or bring witness to violence are brave, courageous and resilient. Trauma-affected children can be found in any classroom and any school- in fact, one in four children experience a traumatic event before they turn three years old (Briggs-Gowan et al., 2010; Cummings 2017). This experience impacts development, behaviour and learning. By understanding the impact of trauma on children and young people, educators can better recognise and then respond to the unique needs and capacities of the child affected by trauma.

Why this course is for you

This short course is an ideal introduction to childhood trauma for all educators including parents, carers and youth workers. Participants will build their knowledge and understanding of the needs of the child affected by trauma and the impact that trauma may have on development, behaviour and learning. Drawing from the fields of education, psychology and neuroscience, knowledge acquisition will focus on an introduction to childhood trauma focussing on complex trauma.
